The Care Team Approach to Planning

Aim: To consolidate previous learning and develop participant's ability to apply legislation, standards, frameworks, and case practice policy and strategies to work effectively with children in care and people significant to the child.

Learning Outcomes

- Explain the role, responsibilities and expectations of the 'corporate parent' and stakeholders involved in children in care practice (for example, the child, parents, foster carers, Department staff and other agencies).
- Develop ideas of how to engage and sustain the relationship with the child, parents, carers and safety/support network in the parallel planning process.
- Apply strategies, tools and procedures required to incorporate the voice of the child in planning and to work together with all stakeholders.
- Develop capacity to plan for reunification and long term out-of-home care together with the child, parents, carers and other key stakeholders.
- Analyse information to make timely decisions in the best interests of the child.
- Understand the impacts of permanency planning for Aboriginal children, families and communities, and the importance of working closely and keeping connections with all stakeholders throughout the process.
