



Trauma Informed Advanced Practice

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Aim: Participants will develop a deeper understanding of the impact of trauma on children, young people, parents and carers and will develop approaches and skills in trauma recovery.

Target group: Experienced Department and Partner-Agency Staff

Learning Outcomes

- Analyse indicators of trauma from a developmentally informed perspective
- Explain the impact of trauma on cognition and memory
- Identify triggers and interrupt trauma re-enactment
- Recognise the potential impacts of intergenerational trauma and epigenetics
- Use trauma profiles to determine the suitability of therapeutic interventions
- Evaluate strategies to support children to heal from trauma
